Diverse Interests	 Knows a wide variety of information, of which most children of this age are unaware Interested in a wide range of things May be intensely interested in non-school subjects May show excitement in voice about discoveries/eager to tell others about discoveries Often attempts to do more than one thing at a time Reads widely and extensively Interested in the arts (music, dance, art, drama) 	3	2	1
Academic	Ability to acquire school knowledge Learns rapidly and retains the material Does some academic work above grade level Enjoys the challenge of difficult problems and activities Independent worker, completes assignments with attention to quality	3	2	1
Leadership	Ability to work with others productively Tends to be a leader, generally directs the activity in which they are involved Adjusts to change with a minimum of difficulty, seems able to take risks	3	2	1
Creativity	 Comes up with many and unusual ideas Is creative, uses imagination or unusual methods or ideas Enjoys fantasy, adding lots of details Venturesome, eager to do new things (don't mark down for shyness) Likes being an individual with his/her own ideas Resourceful - can solve problems in ingenious ways Enjoys new ideas 	3	2	1
Humor	 Ability to see funny relationships Has mature sense of humor (puns, associations, etc) Playful with language May offer silly word meanings or puns at inappropriate times 	3	2	1

May become frustrated when work does not meet own standards Demonstrates persistence in tasks Great desire to excel Self motivated Initiates and applies ideas to own projects May get excited about a subject and learn everything possible about it 	3	2	1

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
