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<p>Widespread power outages</p> 	<p>BSD will work with Puget Sound Energy to determine how wide-spread the power outage is. If it is determined that the power will not be restored to the greater Bremerton area by 9:30 a.m., it will be a non-school day for all students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All BSD facilities closed. ● This will not count as a school day and BSD may be required to make-up the day at the end of the school year (June 17 & 18, academic calendar) ● No synchronous/asynchronous or face-to-face/in-person learning. ● BSD to communicate with staff and families via our usual channels. 	<p>School-year employees (certificated & classified) do not work on these days. Time will be made-up on June 17 & 18 (or another day as agreed upon by an employee’s supervisor)</p> <p>Year-round employees must report to work or take leave. Emergency leave is applicable.</p>	
<p>Power outage impacting a school or smaller area/neighborhood</p> 	<p>The decision will be made on a case-by- case basis and included in the decision will be whether or not Puget Sound Energy predicts the school will be without power for the majority of the day. A decision about the feasibility of transitioning to asynchronous learning for the day will be assessed. If not feasible due to a wide-spread lack of power, school may be canceled for the impacted building(s).</p> <p>We will communicate with the impacted families and staff via our usual channels.</p>	<p>Connected Learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Connected Learning continues on regular schedule. ● Students without power should contact their teachers as soon as possible (excused absence). <p>Hybrid Learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Hybrid pathway students for schools not impacted by power outage will attend school in-person as scheduled. ● Ideally, Hybrid pathway students who attend schools impacted by power outage will pivot to asynchronous learning if power outage is not widespread. ● If the outage is widespread in a neighborhood, the District may cancel school for that building * <p><i>*BSD would need to apply for a waiver to the state for the missed day(s); if the waiver is not granted, the impacted school(s) may be required to make-up the day(s) at the end of the school year.</i></p>	<p>School(s) out of power:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Certificated staff member works remotely OR 2. May work at an alternative worksite to be identified by the district <p>Options for certificated staff member power out at home include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Come to school to work OR 2. Work at another offsite powered location OR 3. Notify supervisor you are taking emergency leave in Frontline
