

# 2020 Replacement Capital Levy Fact Sheet

**The Bremerton School District is proposing a one-year capital levy measure in the February 12th election. This levy will replace the current levy when it expires soon.**

The levy will generate \$7,675,000 to support:

- **Health and safety** such as school security upgrades and HVAC systems.
- **Teaching and community facilities** such as sporting/physical education field improvements, instructional space and energy-efficient lighting.
- **Preservation of District assets** such as roof repair/replacement and sprinkler system repairs and upgrades.

>>This is a one-year levy. If approved in 2019, funds will be collected in calendar year 2020.

>>This capital levy will **replace** the current capital levy, tech levy and bond which all expire at the end of 2019.

While the state provides funding for basic education, school districts rely on voter-approved capital levies to help maintain and improve school facilities.

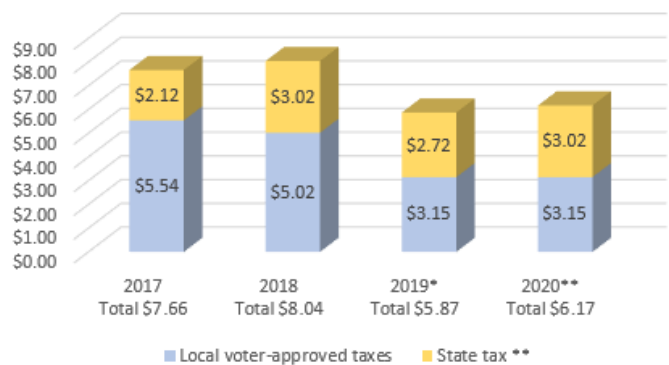
