



## NETWORK/INTERNET ACCEPTABLE USE AGREEMENT FOR STUDENTS 2021-2022

Dear Parent/Guardian:

As part of our commitment to a well-rounded, high-quality educational experience, Bremerton School District provides safe, filtered Internet access, online resources, and digital devices for our students at all grade levels. Use of these resources requires users to act responsibly, ethically, and in accordance with the Bremerton School District Acceptable Use Policy (<http://bit.ly/BSDAUP>). Although the District provides a filtered and supervised setting, there can be no guarantee that all material accessed has educational value. No filtering system is perfect. This places a certain amount of responsibility and self-discipline on the student to follow District guidelines. It is important that you and your child read and discuss the Acceptable Use Policy. Inappropriate use will result in the loss of the privilege to use these educational tools, and other disciplinary action if appropriate. We also reserve the right to review e-mail sent or received on the district system to improve student safety and system integrity. Please stress to your child the importance of following these rules, as any inappropriate use of the Internet or District equipment may result in loss of privileges and other appropriate disciplinary actions.

Please remind your child to use his or her account password, and keep it a secret from other students. Your child should never let anyone else use his/her password to access the network. Your child is responsible for any activity that happens in his/her account.

We have a carefully curated selection of software and online resources that are both core and supplemental, which are integrated into the curriculum. They are vetted for compliance with state and federal privacy laws to protect our students' information. During times when schools are closed to students, teachers may need to provide remote teaching and learning experiences using videoconferencing tools. When participating in a live video meeting, students have the option to mute themselves and/or hide their video display.
